



### **THE RED SCARE**


- As cold war tensions grew throughout Europe and East Asia, the United States fell under the grip of a Red Scare!
- Many Americans feared the communists were infiltrating the country with the purpose of destroying the American way of life
- Not only were Americans afraid that communists were in America they were in constant fear of a possible nuclear war
  - The United States Civil Defense System
    - Originated during World War I
      - Defense against possible attacks on American factories and military installations
      - Enforced blackouts and watched the skies for enemy aircraft After the Soviet Union successfully tested its own atomic bomb
      - Focus turned to the inevitable nuclear attack

- During the 1950s and 1960s, American schools held regular drills to train students what to do in the event of a nuclear attack
  - Taught to "duck and cover"
- The government urged American citizens to build bomb shelters in their basements
  - Civil Defense office distributed plans for building backyard shelters
  - Office workers were trained to find the nearest fallout shelter

- Perceived threat of eventual nuclear war became more widespread
- People built fallout shelters
  - Stockpiled supplies
  - Civil Defense provided plans on how to build
    - Instructions for what supplies to stock
- Shelters turned out not to be necessary No nuclear war
  - Shelters likely would not have provided adequate protection
    - No time to get to them
    - Concrete would not have withstood a nuclear blast
    - Insulation would not have withstood the heat of the fireball
- Fallout shelters served an important psychological purpose
  - Allowed Americans to believe surviving a nuclear war possible
  - Convinced the average citizen that government policies of "mutually assured destruction" and "brinkmanship" were necessary
