

The Partitioning of Germany: 1949

- US, Britain, and France allowed their German zones of occupation to establish themselves as new nations.
 - Western zones formed:
 - "The Federal Republic of Germany"
 - AKA: West Germany
- The Soviet zone established itself as well:
 - "German Democratic Republic"
 - AKA: East Germany
 - Eastern part of the city of Berlin, which was in the Soviet zone, became the capital of East Germany
 - Bonn became capital of West Germany



NATO and the WARSAW PACT

- 1948: western European nations banded together to for a mutual defence treaty
 - European nations knew American involvement was crucial
 - 1949: North Atlantic Treaty Organization was created
 - AKA: **NATO**
 - United States was/is a founding member
 - How NATO worked then (and in many ways, today):
 - If any NATO member were attacked by an external entity, all other


members of NATO would respond to help with such action "as they deemed necessary" including military force

- I.e. if the Soviet Union attacked a western European nation, the United States would consider that an attack on American soil and retaliate
- Soviet Union responded by forming its own alliance with its satellite nations:
 - Warsaw Pact
 - Soviets invaded Hungary 1956 and Czechoslovakia 1968

The Warsaw Pact, so named because the treaty was signed in Warsaw,

included:

- The Soviet Union
- Albania
- Poland
- Romania
- Hungary
- East Germany
- Czechoslovakia
- Bulgaria
